#### ADVENT - Begins on the 2nd of December

**Fr Gerard writes:** I am glad that we have a tradition of early morning Masses in the parish for Advent and Lent. This Advent Mass will be on **Thursday** mornings in Advent at 6.30am followed by breakfast. I would like to make a Rorate Mass I was introduced to this beautiful Advent practice when I was in Crawley. A young German intern was working for the Diocese at DABCEC and asked if we could host the Mass early in the morning in the parish.

The result was beautiful, and I was able to take this Advent practice to Eastbourne and now here. Please find a description of what it is. It really makes my Advent. I hope it will make yours, too.

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion popular in many places in Europe and among families, some bring their own lamps to the Mass. The Mass is for the Blessed Virgin Mary in Advent and is offered just before dawn. This Mass captures the hearts and minds of many people, the interplay of light and darkness speaking to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world. The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8

“Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem.”

“Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just:  
let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour.”

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honour, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet, and the Gloria is said. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honour the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. The readings and prayers of Advent foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.

#### **Parish Maintenance Projects:**

There are many projects of maintenance that need to be undertaken in the church, the house and the hall. I am also aware that the sound system in the Church is slowly dying on us. It is losing sound and the loop system for those with hearing aids is not working. Many people have come to me to tell of their frustrations in being unable to fully hear the Sacred Liturgy. This is vital for maintaining a spiritual life so that people can be fed on the Word of God and the language of our Ritual. This requires attention and I request the generosity of the Parish towards the general maintenance costs. A new sound system will cost £18,000 and I would ask you to be generous and donate towards this.

- ★ Edge of Care and Homelessness Prevention Service: Supporting teenagers and their families where there is a risk of family breakdown. They prevent young people going into local authority care. They also work with 16-18 year olds who are at risk of homelessness. The Service supports them when they go into supported accommodation or independent living.
- ★ LinkAble: helps children and adults with learning disabilities in Woking and Surrey Heath. They offer people activities and experiences that they struggle to access in the wider community, supporting them to learn new skills, form lasting friendships, and lead fulfilling, independent lives. Whilst they have a fully accessible centre in Woking, they also work in the local community. They provide weekly groups for children, young people and adults, and holiday schemes, providing vital respite for exhausted parents and carers.
- ★ Woking Lions: Supporting less fortunate families and the elderly in the Woking area.
- ★ Abraham Cowley Unit at St Peter's: This is a 20 bed acute assessment and treatment inpatient unit for people over 65 experiencing a functional mental health illness which necessitates an admission into hospital.

**Fr Gerard writes :** On a rota basis with other priests of the diocese, I have recently begun celebrating Mass on Saturday mornings at nearby Coldingly Prison. When it is my turn to do so, our 10am Saturday Mass for that week will need to move to 12 noon, with Adoration and Confessions before Mass. The dates and times will be notified. The Prison Lay Chaplain is very grateful for the two volunteers from our parish who add so much to the faith life of the prisoners, and she would like to strengthen our links and make us more aware of their presence in our parish community. She has liaised with Security and the Deputy Governor, and they are happy for Christmas cards and chocolate bars (e.g. KitKat, Twix, Bounty, etc.) to be brought in from our Parish. It is a lovely way for us as a Parish community to reach out to the 75 Roman Catholic prisoners here who find Christmas a very difficult time.

So, from this Sunday there will be a sign-up sheet so that you can write to a prison inmate.

The cards can be addressed "Dear brother in Christ" with a message of Christmas Faith, Hope, and Love, and then signed with first names only. Bring the cards and chocolate donations on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup>/9<sup>th</sup> December and they will be delivered to Coldingly on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> December.

Thank you in advance for the generous response which I know will be forthcoming.
