### Holy Week Traditions

**Praying as a Family:** The most important task of Holy Week is to pray. Find ways to do that.

**Blessed Palms:** Anything blessed protects us from danger. Palms are always to be found in homes for the whole year, renewed till the next year's blessing of palms. To make Palm Crosses, Google it.

**Spring Cleaning:** Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week are designated as days for vigorous house cleaning in preparation for Easter. This comes from the Jewish ritual of cleaning before Passover.

**Home Altar:** Make a home altar for your focus this week, veil a crucifix, make a tomb, use flowers, candles (plastic ones if you have children) and decorations when we get to Easter.

**Visiting Churches:** The tradition of visiting seven Churches and their Altar of Repose on Holy Thursday is a way of making a small pilgrimage to pray. This year that's not so easy, but you can still do that through the wonderful web.

**Washing of the Feet:** In the Gospel of John, Jesus washes his disciples' feet during Passover, so do this on Holy Thursday with your family.

**Kissing the Cross:** On Good Friday venerate a cross in your house with a kiss and pray for all those in the world who need our prayers.

**Fish on Good Friday:** Good Friday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence. On this day we do not eat meat, so try fish or a vegetable dish.

**Baking:** Holy Week is a time for baking sweet breads, cakes and pastries. Try hot cross buns.

**New Clothes:** A beautiful tradition is dressing in new clothes on Easter Sunday, just like the newly Baptised symbolising the "new life" that comes with the Resurrection.

**Easter Candle:** As a family make a mini Paschal candle. It has to have a cross with five wounds, the year and Alpha and Omega on it. This is a symbol of the Risen Christ who is the light of the world.

**Colouring Eggs:** Decorating eggs is a symbol of new life which comes with the Resurrection.

**Holy Water:** Easter is when we renew our baptismal promises. This year you will be able to take Holy Water home, which will be blessed during the Easter Vigil Mass, to bless your homes.

**Easter Bonnet:** Easter parades and egg hunts are some fun things to do on Easter Sunday; here is your scribe in one himself.

### **CHURCH OPENING FOR HOLY WEEK/EASTER SERVICES**

**Please note that all slots are now filled in line with our Church capacity.**

If you wish to be placed on a waiting list, please use the [Holy Week & Easter Bookings](#) link or telephone the Parish Office (01483 472404), stating your preferred time of Mass and number attending.

An email will be sent to you confirming you have been placed on the waiting list.

Please refer to the Holy Week poster or the Holy Week Schedule below for details of our services.

- Unless you have booked, please do not come to the Church. Sad though it is, we will not be able to admit you to the Church as our capacity will have been reached and for the safety of those who have booked and for your own safety.
- In line with the guidance, face coverings should be worn in Church covering both the nose and mouth.
- Church will open 15 mins before Mass and will close after Mass for cleaning ready for the next Mass.
- If you have the 'Track and Trace' NHS Covid-19 app, please scan the QR code.
- We are unable to allow people to stand in the aisles, at the back or in the Narthex. You must not mix with anyone outside your household or support bubble indoors or outdoors. You should maintain strict social distancing at all times.

Whilst full guidelines are on display in the Narthex, please remember:

- Use the sanitiser provided as you enter and leave the Church and remember social distancing
- You will be guided to your place by the Steward and they will also instruct you when to move forward for Holy Communion
- Access to the Sacristy and Narthex will not be allowed
- Please note, good ventilation reduces the risks from airborne transmission and so windows will be open in the Church. Please put on an extra layer to keep warm!
- Do not mingle before or after Mass outside the Church. Please disperse immediately.
