Here are some facts that you might not have known about the Sacred Heart of Jesus who the month of June is dedicated:

- 1. The devotion to the Sacred Heart is over 900 years old:** In the 11th century St. Peter Damien wrote about the Heart of Jesus - see it above.
- 2. There was more than one saint who had visions of the Sacred Heart:** In the 1200's three nuns had visions: St. Mechtild of Magdeburg, St. Mechtild of Hakeborn and St. Gertrude the Great. This happened at the Monastery of St. Mary of Helfta.
- 3. St. Margaret Mary started having visions of Jesus, typically crucified, early in her life:** She assumed that this was normal for everyone.
- 4. The Feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated before St. Margaret Mary's visions:** On August 31, 1670 a celebration in honour of the Sacred Heart was celebrated at the seminary in Rennes.
- 5. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque had multiple visions of the Sacred Heart from 1673 – 1675:** During the visions Christ told St. Margaret that he wanted three specific devotions done to honour His Sacred Heart – frequent communion, receiving Communion at Mass on the first Friday of the month and regular holy hours.
- 6. The Jesuits were involved:** St. Margaret Mary's confessor was St Claude de Colombiere. In 1675 Jesus asked St. Margaret to tell Fr. Colombiere about her visions and entrusted the propagation of the devotion to the Sacred Heart to the Sisters of the Visitation and the Society of Jesus. Fr. Colombiere asked St. Margaret to write an account of the visions, consecrated himself to the Sacred Heart and spent the rest of his life spreading information about the devotion in France and England.
- 7. The Church didn't move quickly:** While the Church officially granted St. Margaret's Order, the Visitandines, permission to celebrate a Mass in honour of the Five Wounds of Christ in 1697, it wasn't until 1856 that Pope Pius IX made the Feast of the Sacred Heart a universal celebration. In 1899 Pope Leo XIII consecrated all mankind to the Sacred Heart.
- 8. Jesus was very serious about the mercy He offered through devotion to His Sacred Heart:** Jesus made several promises to St. Margaret Mary for those who received communion in a state of grace on nine consecutive first Fridays, but the most important one was *“I promise the Grace of final perseverance. They will not die in My disgrace, but will receive the Sacraments (if necessary), and My Heart will be sure shelter for them in that extreme moment.”*

Public Masses will be 6pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Fridays and Sundays 8am, 10am and 5pm.

Bookings required for these Masses except Mondays and Tuesdays.

- To book your place, please email knaphill@abdiocese.org.uk or telephone the Parish Office on 01483 472404, stating your preferred time of Mass and number attending; you should receive an email confirming your place in due course.
- Deadline for booking is 3.00pm on the Friday afternoon. It is important to book as we do not want to turn anyone away if capacity is reached.
- Unless you have booked, please do not come to the Church. Sad though it is, we will not be able to admit you to the Church as our capacity will have been reached and for the safety of those who have booked and for your own safety.
- In line with the guidance, face coverings should be worn in Church covering both the nose and mouth.
- Church will open 15 mins before Mass and will close after Mass for cleaning ready for the next Mass.
- If you have the 'Track and Trace' NHS Covid-19 app, please scan the QR code.
- We are unable to allow people to stand in the aisles, at the back or in the Narthex. You must not mix with anyone outside your household or support bubble indoors or outdoors. You should maintain strict social distancing at all times.

Whilst full guidelines are on display in the Narthex, please remember:

- Use the sanitiser provided as you enter and leave the Church and remember social distancing
- You will be guided to your place by the Steward and they will also instruct you when to move forward for Holy Communion
- Access to the Sacristy and Narthex will not be allowed
- Please note, good ventilation reduces the risks from airborne transmission and so windows will be open in the Church. Please put on an extra layer to keep warm!
- Do not mingle before or after Mass outside the Church. Please disperse immediately.

People of the Parish

This prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus comes from St John Cardinal Henry Newman, a renowned 19th century convert to Catholicism from Anglicanism who wrote extensively about our faith. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in September, 2010 and canonized by Pope Francis in October, 2019. On his coat of arms when he became Cardinal in 1879 the phrase "Heart speaks unto heart", reflecting his desires expressed beautifully below:

Most Sacred, most loving Heart of Jesus, You are concealed in the Holy Eucharist, And You beat for us still. Now, as then, You say: "With desire I have desired."

I worship You with all my best love and awe, With fervent affection, With my most subdued, most resolved will. For a while You take up Your abode within me.

O make my heart beat with Your Heart! Purify it of all that is earthly, All that is proud and sensual, All that is hard and cruel, Of all perversity, Of all disorder, Of all deadness. So fill it with You, That neither the events of the day, Nor the circumstances of the time, May have the power to ruffle it; But that in Your love and Your fear, It may have peace.
