Fun Fact: Did you know that the McDonald's Fillet-o-Fish was created for Catholics to eat on Fridays?

Fish on Friday is a well-known Catholic tradition, but as things go it's easier said than done. Why not try to put it back into your weekly routine? Why do we have to eat fish on a Friday? In fact, not eating meat on Fridays can be traced back to Jewish fasting traditions (*Leviticus 11 & 23:26-32*).

The Jewish people would fast from some animal products on certain days of the week. The early Christians adopted this for Wednesdays and Fridays. They did this because Wednesday was the day that Jesus was Spied upon at the beginning of his betrayal and Friday was when he was crucified and died. While Eastern Catholics tend to keep this practice for both days, in the West, historically, it has only been important to fast on Friday. But why is fish allowed if the fast is meant to be from animal products? It's a good question and actually has a really interesting reason behind it!

The practice of our faith and its allowance for fish on days of abstinence has a mystical relationship to the Great Flood of Noah, in which it rained for forty days and forty nights. This has always been linked to Lent as both are forty-day periods of universal cleansing. During this time, Noah and his family ate fish, since they were not permitted to eat the animals on board the ark. Moreover, the fish were preserved in the Great Flood as fish can swim, but land animals were not as they drowned. For this reason, fish has always been exempt from meat-based fasts.

Amusingly, with this logic, there have been several concessions throughout the years that the Church has said that certain animals can be eaten on Friday, such as penguins and puffins, both of whom were considered to not break this rule! Not for me thanks! We often regard fasting as a burden that makes our days less fun, but at its core fasting is something that should allow us to live life more to the full and pray. When we actively choose to deny ourselves something, it prevents that thing controlling our life. By cutting out a regular feature of our normal diet, we hope to prevent ourselves becoming enslaved to food. Essentially, we are fasting so that when we eat, we eat to live rather than live to eat. Since 2012 our Bishops have given us the chance to practice this every Friday. While abstaining from meat is a great regular abstinence, it can also help us to have a healthier relationship with our material goods! It also keeps us close to the Passion of Christ and a way of doing so practically.

Please pray for our children who will receive Our Lord for the first time in Holy Communion.

- Deadline for booking is 3.00pm on the Friday afternoon. It is important to book as we do not want to turn anyone away if capacity is reached.
- Unless you have booked, please do not come to the Church. Sad though it is, we will not be able to admit you to the Church as our capacity will have been reached and for the safety of those who have booked and for your own safety.

This prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus comes from St John Cardinal Henry Newman, a renowned 19th century convert to Catholicism from Anglicanism who wrote extensively about our faith. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in September, 2010 and canonized by Pope Francis in October, 2019. On his coat of arms when he became Cardinal in 1879 the phrase "Heart speaks unto heart", reflecting his desires expressed beautifully below:

Most Sacred, most loving Heart of Jesus, You are concealed in the Holy Eucharist, And You beat for us still. Now, as then, You say: "With desire I have desired."

I worship You with all my best love and awe, With fervent affection, With my most subdued, most resolved will. For a while You take up Your abode within me.

O make my heart beat with Your Heart! Purify it of all that is earthly, All that is proud and sensual, All that is hard and cruel, Of all perversity, Of all disorder, Of all deadness. So fill it with You, That neither the events of the day, Nor the circumstances of the time, May have the power to ruffle it; But that in Your love and Your fear, It may have peace.
