**The Year of St Joseph**

Dear Friends

On the 26th of July, Holy Church remembers Sts Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Our Lady and their role as the maternal grandparents of Jesus. The “Protoevangelium of James,” written in the early second century, describes Joachim, as a member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel and a shepherd. Joachim, along with his wife Anne, were saddened by their childlessness. “He often called to mind Abraham,” the writings say, “that in his last days God gave him a son Isaac.” Joachim and Anne devoted themselves to prayer and fasting, in isolation from society. They regarded their inability to conceive a child as a surpassing misfortune, and a sign of shame among the Tribes of Israel. Eventually the holy couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah. An angel revealed this to Anne and told her that all generations would honour their future child: “The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth; and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world.” After Mary’s birth, according to the Protoevangelium of James, Anne “made a sanctuary” in the infants room, and “allowed nothing common or unclean” on account of the special holiness of the child. James writes when she was one year old, her father “made a great feast, and invited the priests, and the scribes, and the elders, and all the people of Israel.” “And Joachim brought the child to the priests,” the account continues, “and they blessed her, saying: ‘O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations’ ... And he brought her to the chief priests; and they blessed her, saying: ‘O God most high, look upon this child, and bless her with the utmost blessing, which shall be forever.’” The Protoevangelium goes on to describe how Mary’s parents, along with the temple priests, offered her to God as a consecrated Virgin, and then she entered a chaste marriage with the carpenter, Joseph. Laying everything in hand for the Annunciation of the Lord.

The Bishops' Conference of England & Wales ask:

After the summer break, we hope to resume the Sunday Masses at 8am (Latin), 9.30am and 11.30am. Sunday Obligation will return in Advent.

Altar Servers can come back and for any new servers, training will be arranged or refresher training for existing Servers. Please speak with Fr Gerard.

Ministers of the Word and Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are invited to assist at the 6pm Vigil Mass and 10am Sunday Mass.


