**Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B  
22nd August 2021 - The Year of St Joseph**

Dear Friends,

This liturgical year the gospel readings at Mass on Sundays are taken primarily from the Gospel of Mark. However, we are in the middle of hearing from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John and the focus is on the Most Holy Eucharist.

A Eucharistic miracle does not give extra certainty to the real presence of Jesus as our faith believes truly that, through the Mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection, He gives Himself in the Eucharist, for the life and purpose of the Church on earth.

No Eucharist, no Church, simply put.

But Eucharistic miracles are extraordinary events in the life of the Church, where the Eucharist no longer appears under the accidents of bread and wine, but takes on the biological qualities of human flesh or blood or both. These miracles have no scientific explanation, but can be scientifically verified, and help us go beyond the visible and perceptible to the existence of something beyond and supernatural.

They can deepen our love for Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. They can help us with any doubts that we might face about the real presence.

Blessed Carlo Acutis, as you know, was a teenager from Italy who had a great love for Jesus and a deep devotion to the Eucharist, which he called “my highway to heaven.” Before his death to leukaemia in 2006 at the age of 15, Carlo documented all the verified Eucharistic miracles from around the world and catalogued them onto a website, that he himself called ‘Eucharistic Miracles of the World’. “To always be close to Jesus, that’s my life plan.” There are over 100 Eucharistic miracles recorded on Carlo’s website, categorised according to country.

The earliest of these dates back to the 8th century AD, and the most recent having taken place in Sokółka, Poland in 2008. For each of the miracles listed, a PDF providing information and images is available for download here:



## Covid-19 Route Map Stage 4 Guidance What it means for us?

- **With immediate effect bookings for all Masses will not be necessary.**
- For all Sunday Masses, to register your Mass attendance, if you have the 'Test, Track and Trace' NHS Covid-19 App, please scan the QR code found here, in the narthex or in the display cabinet outside the church.
- To download the App, please see the simple instructions on the noticeboard in the narthex.
- If you do not have the App, please register with the Steward.
- As there is no legal requirement on social distancing, the tape has been removed. We will, of course, need to be respectful of those around us.
- At the Vigil and 10.00am Mass, you will be guided by the Steward as to when to move forward for Holy Communion, returning to your place via the side aisle as before.
- For all other Masses, please move forward for Holy Communion one row at a time and reasonably distanced, returning to your place via the side aisle.
- The obligation to attend Mass will be restored by the First Sunday of Advent.



### The Bishops' Conference of England & Wales ask:

### **10th Anniversary of the Syrian conflict – how your donations have helped the Syrian people**
