Dear Friends,

A test; can you remember the names of the seven sacraments?

There are seven sacraments no more, no less, for the simple reason that Our Lord instituted seven. These seven sacraments are a gift of love from Him, a gift for which He paid with His very life.

The sacraments are seven great streams of grace flowing from the pierced Heart of Jesus crucified, to nourish and strengthen our souls. By His Resurrection and Ascension they are the perpetual memorial of His love, brought to us by the work of the Holy Spirit and the passing down from generation to generation through the priesthood, as an outward sign instituted by Christ to His Apostles to give Grace. An outward sign is something perceived by the senses. The external thing or action is called the matter, and the formula of the words, the form of the sacrament. For example, we see the water used in Baptism; we hear the words pronounced as the water is poured. These are sensible signs perceived by the senses of sight and hearing. The sacraments signify the graces they actually give. So the washing in Baptism signifies the inward washing of the soul from sin. The sacraments always give the graces they signify, provided the recipient puts no obstacles between them and the Grace of God. It is principally through the sacraments that we obtain the Grace of God. They are the channels by which grace enters our souls, to feed and nourish them.

The sacraments receive their power to give grace from God, through the merits of Jesus Christ. Each sacrament will possess the power from God to make the soul of the recipient holy and pleasing to Him. This supernatural power is termed, Sanctifying Grace. Sanctifying Grace is abiding and permanent and lost only by mortal sin. The sacrament that first gives this grace is Baptism. The sacrament that restores this grace to those who have lost it by sin is Penance. The other sacraments give an increase of Sanctifying Grace. Each Sacrament also gives a grace proper to itself, a special effect on the soul, distinct from the effects of other sacraments; this is called Sacramental Grace. If received with the proper dispositions, the sacraments always gives grace.

Covid-19 Route Map Stage 4 Guidance What it means for us?

- **With immediate effect bookings for all Masses will not be necessary.**
- For all Sunday Masses, to register your Mass attendance, if you have the 'Test, Track and Trace' NHS Covid-19 App, please scan the QR code found here, in the narthex or in the display cabinet outside the church.
- To download the App, please see the simple instructions on the noticeboard in the narthex.
- If you do not have the App, please register with the Steward.
- As there is no legal requirement on social distancing, the tape has been removed. We will, of course, need to be respectful of those around us.
- At the Vigil and 10.00am Mass, you will be guided by the Steward as to when to move forward for Holy Communion, returning to your place via the side aisle as before.
- For all other Masses, please move forward for Holy Communion one row at a time and reasonably distanced, returning to your place via the side aisle.
- The obligation to attend Mass will be restored by the First Sunday of Advent.
