- Booking a seat for Mass is no longer necessary.
- For all Sunday Masses, to register your Mass attendance, if you have the 'Track and Trace' NHS Covid-19 App, please scan the QR code found here, in the narthex or in the display cabinet outside the church.
- To download the App, please see the simple instructions on the noticeboard in the narthex.
- If you do not have the App, please register with the Welcomer.
- Whilst there is no legal requirement on social distancing, we will, of course, need to be respectful of those around us.
- Please move forward for Holy Communion one row at a time and reasonably distanced, returning to your place via the side aisle.



The obligation to attend Mass will be restored by the First Sunday of Advent.

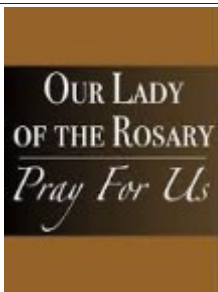
