THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

Though the number of Sundays after Pentecost annually fluctuates due to the variation of Easter Sunday, they are not merely "fillers" until Advent and are deserving of our full attention during the liturgical year. Rather, the time after Pentecost, with the Sundays of Ordinary Time, helps us to continue the spiritual growth stemming from Lent. Paschaltide, namely, the redemptive Resurrection and Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ and the descent of the Holy Spirit. So this time is meant to keep the flame alive in our lives and in our hearts. This is the time when we mature in our faith and where we give ourselves time to let God grow in us.

This maturing of the spiritual life is signified by the green vesture that adorns the altar (e.g. the frontal and veils over the Tabernacle and lectern) and worn by the priest and deacon during this time. This helps us to know that there is nothing ordinary in Ordinary Time. Green is used to deepen the mysteries of Christ that focus on His three years of public ministry, pertaining to his teachings, miracles, exorcisms, and His Proclamation of the Kingdom of God and His encounter with sinners who He brings to life. His work on earth is the restoration of mankind. So we can hope in the mysteries of salvation. We focus on the life He shared with mankind during His time on this earth, the life we share now with Him in the community of the Church and through His sacraments, and the everlasting life we look forward to sharing with Him perfectly in Heaven. Green appropriately symbolizes this hope and life, just as the hint of green on trees in early Spring arouses the hope of new life.

The meeting with the Bishop last Wednesday evening about my departure and the future of the parish in the hands of St Dunstan's went well. Thank you for your kind wishes, prayers and to those who sent in questions. The meeting can be viewed on the Parish Facebook.

Contactless Giving using your debit/credit card via the 'white' machines

Over the last few months more parishioners have been returning to church and have been wondering what the 'white' machines used at the end of Mass are for? These devices were promoted by the Diocese during the pandemic when touching cash was considered a risk Covid wise, but also over the last few years parishes have been discouraged from dealing with cash due to security issues and the demise of High Street banks.

- In the Narthex we have our digital collection plate / contactless machine. It provides you with the option of giving to the parish via the Offertory button (instead of putting cash in the basket that is passed around in the church); you can choose to Gift Aid your donation if you are a taxpayer. The machine will require you to put in your details and this information is strictly private. Once entered you do not have to re-enter your details every time you donate. Please note! If you are an existing Gift Aid donor, you still need to opt-in for Gift Aid on this system – it is not linked to the envelope or standing order system. This device also allows you to pay for Repository items, give to retiring collections, pay for Mass Intentions etc. Just follow the easy instructions on the screen and all donations are anonymous.
- The hand held device monitored by the Welcomers, is also a digital collection plate / contactless device. However, it only gives you the option of giving to the parish via the Offertory and *does not* have the Gift Aid option. You enter the amount you wish to donate and either tap your card or enter your PIN number.
- All data is kept securely in accordance with GDPR guidance.

Whilst the Parish Finance Committee are very grateful for all donations to parish funds, we particularly welcome monthly standing orders as it helps us budget accordingly. If you would like to set up a standing order or wish to know more about Gift Aid, please contact ga.knaphill@abdiocese.org.uk.
